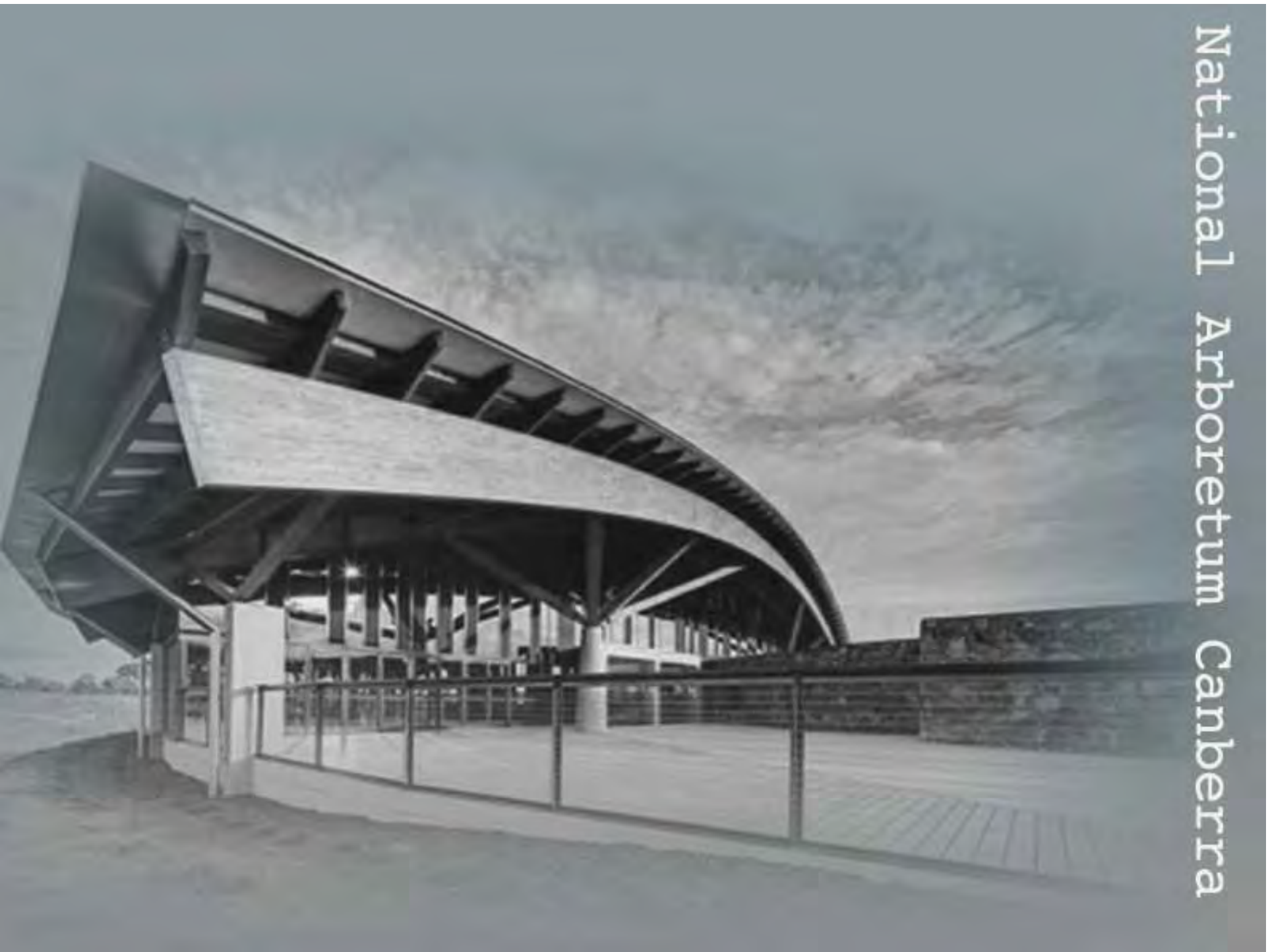


National Arboretum Canberra



SITE & APPROACH

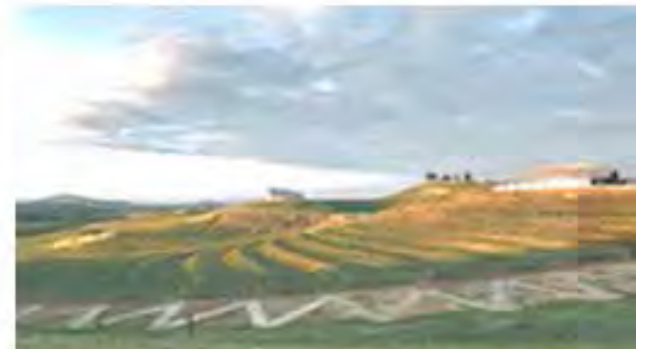


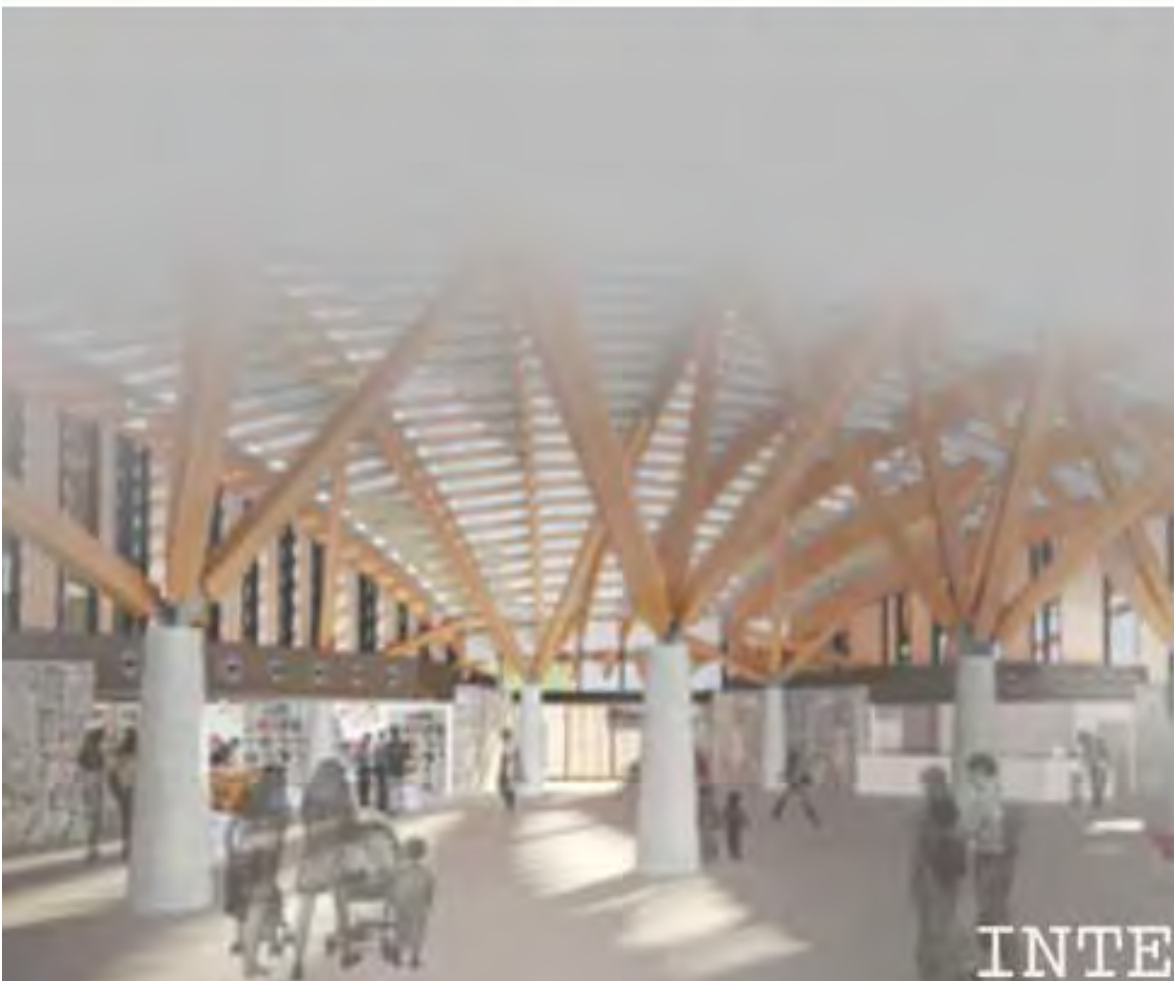
ORIENTATION

The Arboretum is located on the East-West ridge of the land. It has stunning views of Central Valley and the recently planted forestry.

The winding road leads one through the forestry and makes its way to the Village Center.

Once entering the parking garage it will lead you through a beautifully lit pathway into the Arboretum's cafe and gift shop.





INTERIOR

The Arboretum is a low cost energy efficient building. It has taken many measurements to preserve the integrity of the land surrounding it. The exterior is designed around the rolling typography of the acre around it. The interior has a natural essence. The column design was inspired by the forest surrounding Canberra. The timber was produced with low energy and little environmental impact.

NTRY & ORGANIZATION



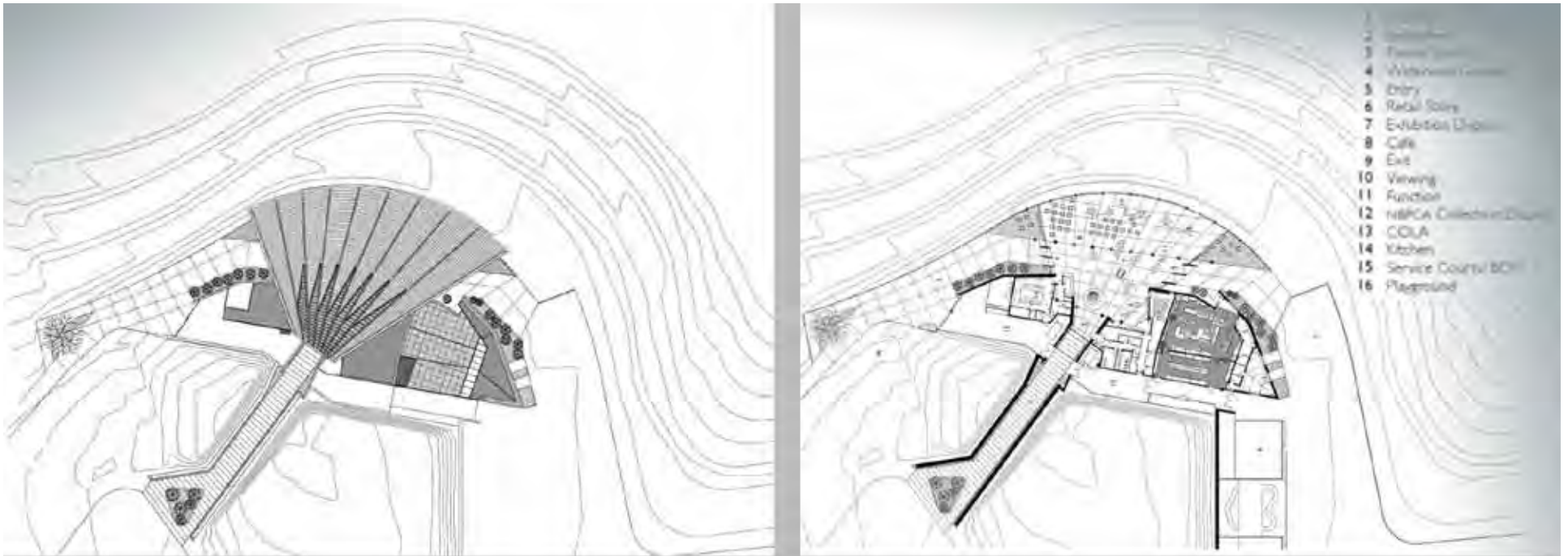
